The Alliance for the Defence of Canadian Sovereignty (ADCS-ADSC) is registered under the Not-for-Profit Act of Canada.

It has no legal affiliation with The Isaac Brock Society. Peter W. Dunn, founding administrator of The Isaac Brock Society, has kindly given permission for ADCS-ADSC to use a post on the Brock website to solicit money for ADCS-ADSC litigation and to provide litigation updates. This does not imply that The Isaac Brock Society or contributors to the Isaac Brock Society support the activities of ADCS-ADSC.

Two of the four ADCS-ADSC Directors, Carol Tapanila (since 2011) and Patricia Moon (since 2013) are members of the Isaac Brock Society “Committee”. Two Directors (Stephen Kish and John Richardson) of ADCS-ADSC, who reside permanently in Canada, are citizens of Canada and also citizens of the United States. Two ADCS-ADSC Directors (Carol Tapanila and Patricia Moon) are Canadian citizens who are no longer United States Citizens because they renounced United States citizenship. Stephen is also a plaintiff with six other plaintiffs in a lawsuit, funded by Republicans Overseas Action Inc., and filed in July 2015 in United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio. The lawsuit challenges FATCA, the IGAs “negotiated” between United States and Canada and other countries under threat of economic sanction, and the FBAR, administered by the United States Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN). The defendants are the United States Department of Treasury, Internal Revenue Service, and FinCEN.
